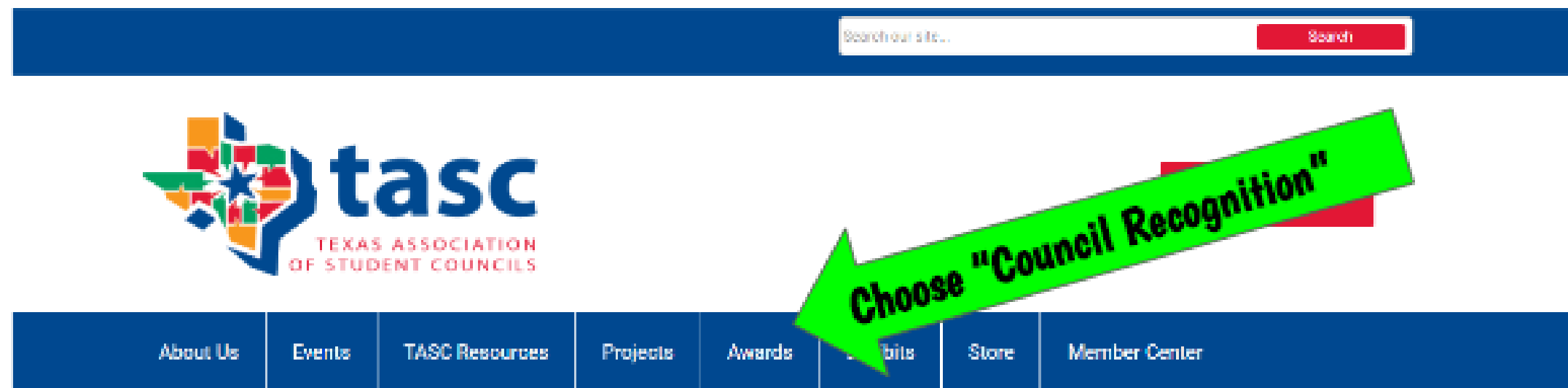

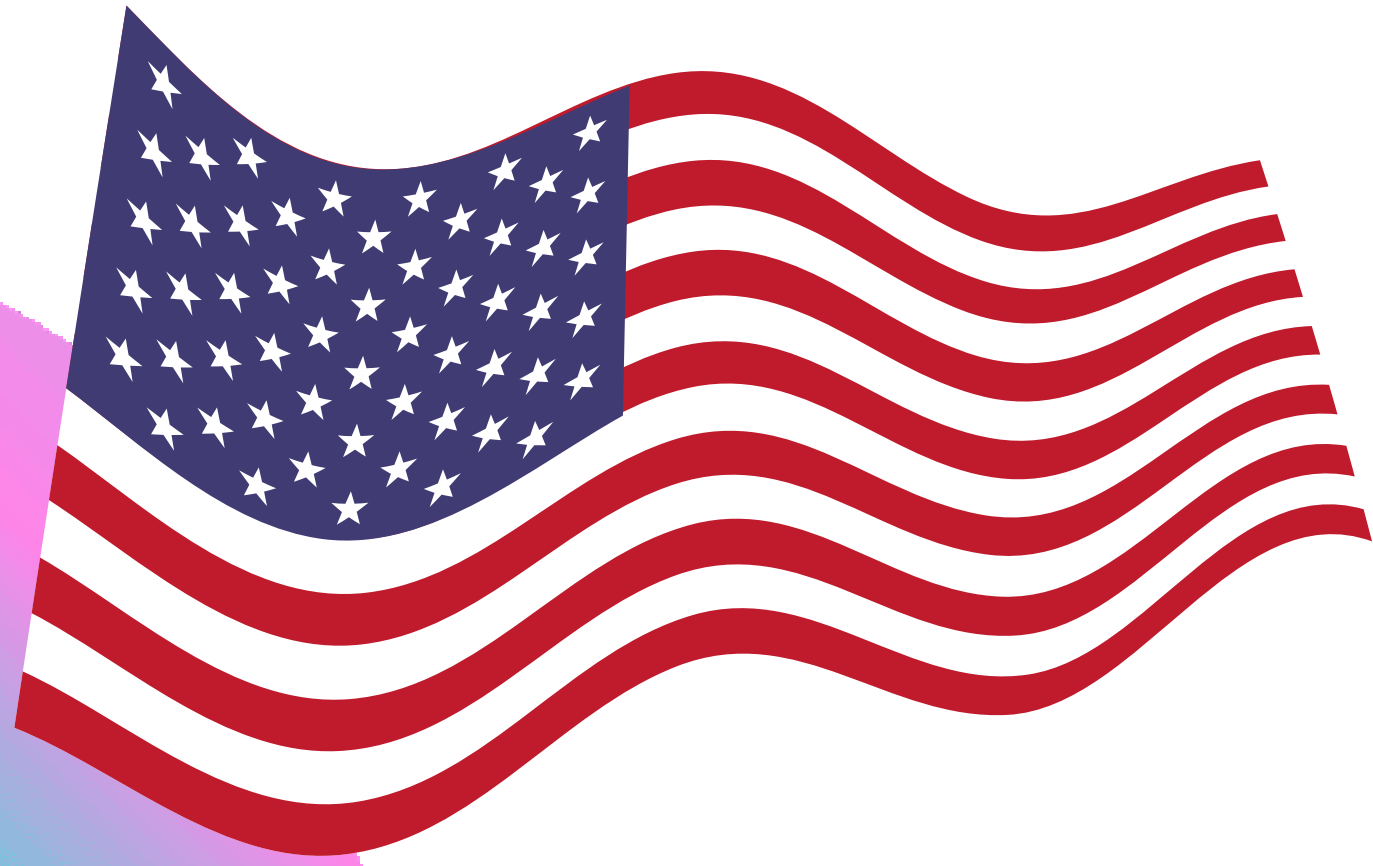

What is P&P



Pride & Patriotism

The purpose of this program is to encourage student councils to participate in/conduct projects projects that promote pride and patriotism. National pride and patriotism, state pride and patriotism, local (school and community) pride, and individual pride are the focal points of this program.

From the 2020-2021 State Report Form

SWEEPSTAKES/REPORTING AREA AWARDS

- I. To earn recognition in an individual reporting area (P&P, E&E, DASH), a high school council must have a total of 225 points. This is equivalent to 15 regular projects. However, one (1) challenge project is equivalent to two (2) regular projects. Project ideas are listed at the end of this document.
- II. To earn the Sweepstakes Award, you must receive Outstanding Award recognition AND meet the requirements for all of the four reporting areas: Pride and Patriotism, Energy and Environment, Drug, Alcohol, Safety and Health, and Community Service.
- III. Each challenge project must be applicable to the reporting category in which it is documented.
- IV. Submission of the Community Service Report Form is required, but there are no point requirements for Community Service.
- V. Projects used in individual reporting areas may be listed in multiple areas. For example, a project may be used for Pride and Patriotism and Energy and Environment.

NOTE: Challenge projects are defined as a **NEW** or **SIGNIFICANT EXPANSION** of an activity or project that focuses on a specific area as defined later in this form.

P&P Challenge Project

- Conduct a new project or significantly enhance a previous project
- Show support for appreciation for frontline essential healthcare workers
- Counts as 2 P&P Projects



For example....

- Letter writing campaigns
- Providing meals or snacks/deliveries
- Host a rest/relaxation event
- Appreciation parade

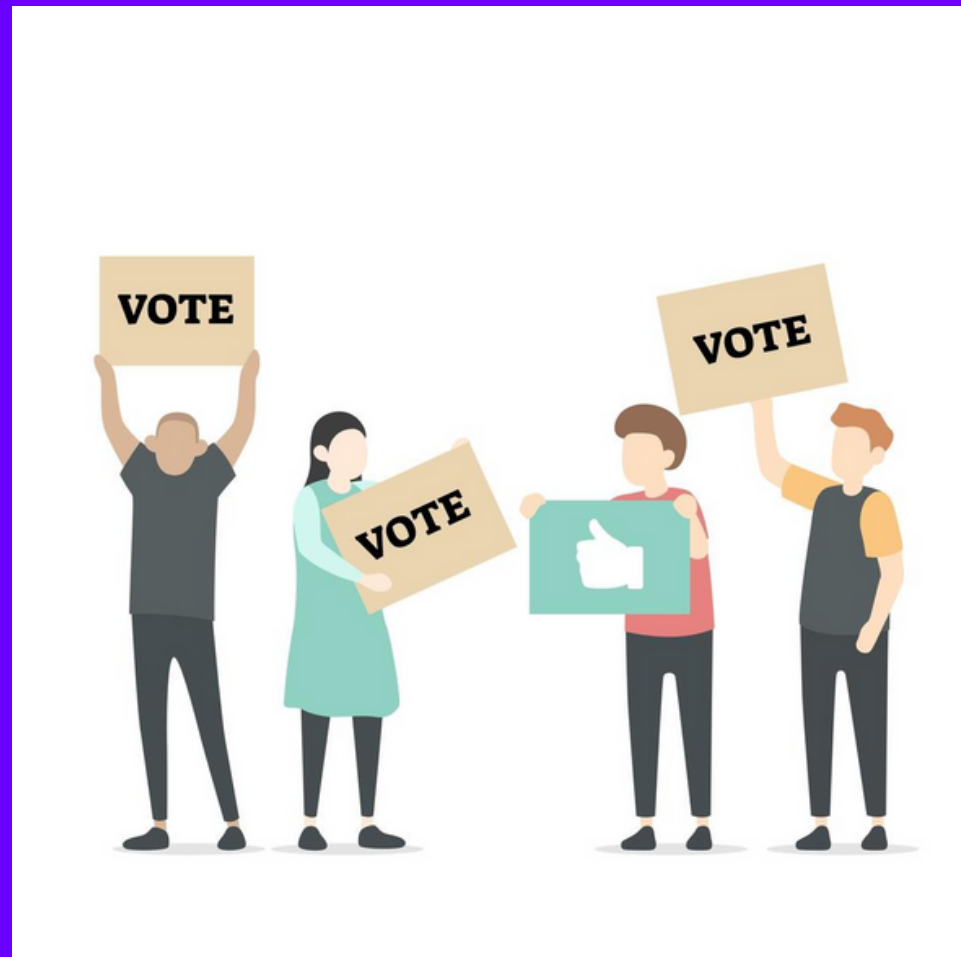

Support local businesses by having different people choose a local business and purchase something from them and leave a “We’re all in this together note.”

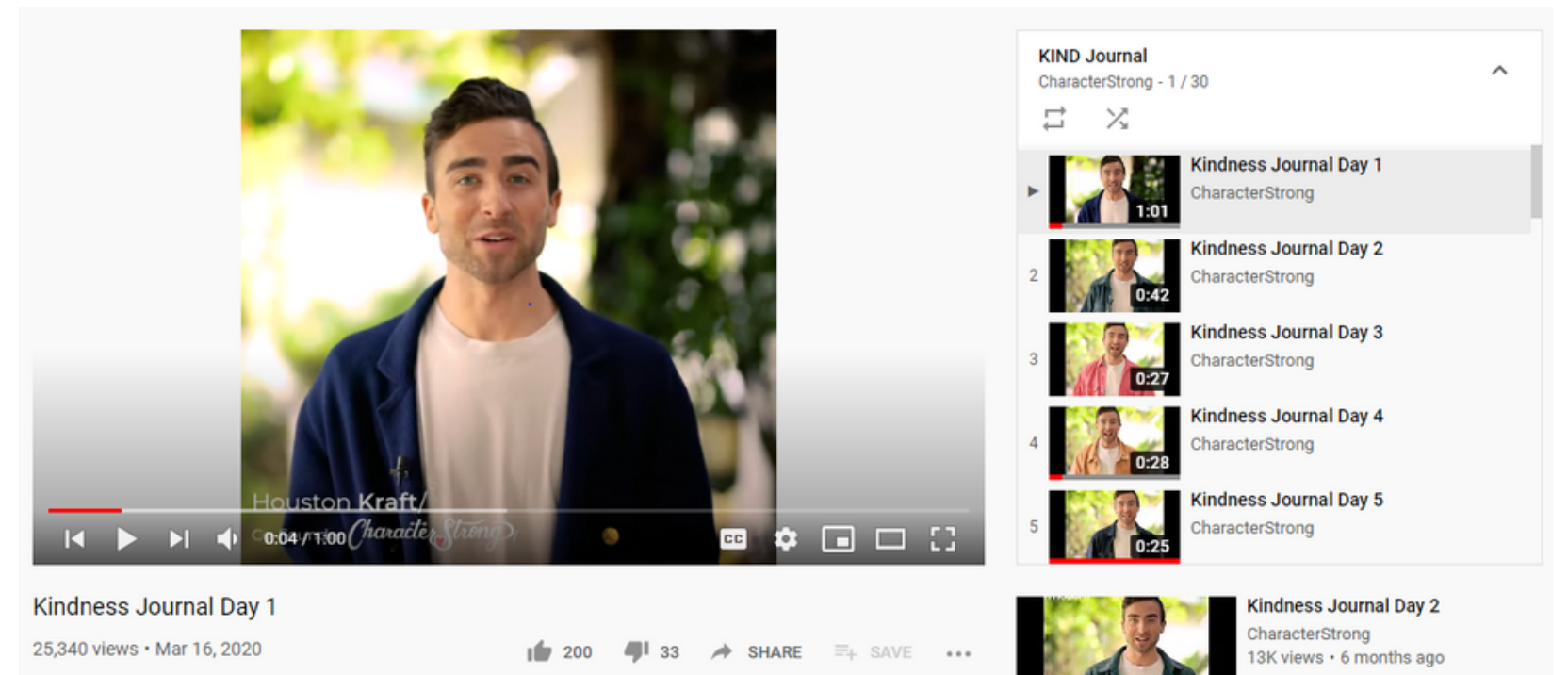


School P&P Ideas....

QR Codes link to a motivational image

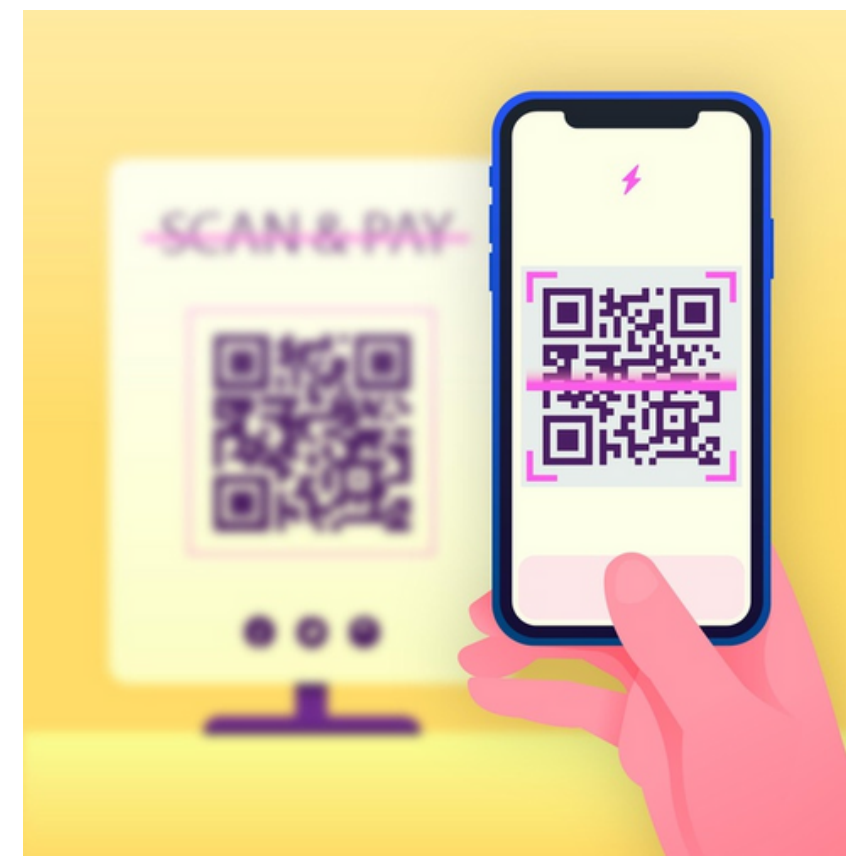
Great for Hybrid Schools (virtual students can create your QR codes/images and in-person students can maintain the board)
