What's in it for students?

Research gathered by the Alliance for Student Activities clearly shows students involved in at least one organized school Student Activity are more likely to do well academically, have higher test scores, graduate, and find college and career success. And, they are less likely to get involved with drugs, abuse alcohol, or drop out of high school. Student Activities are critical to keeping students engaged in their school environment.

Why student council specifically? College admissions personnel and HR personnel are experts at reading resumes. Simply being a member of an organization says little. It's what the member did that speaks. Student Council members truly have voice and ownership, and they work to engage others and serve their school. They plan and complete projects. They make good things happen; and they are prepared to succeed in education beyond high school and career.

Through TASC, student leaders and emerging leaders meet others with the same *passion to serve* they have. TASC gives them the training, the support, and the resources to serve successfully. TASC prepares students for a *lifetime of leadership*.

What's in it for advisors?

No one is a success in a classroom without *training and support*. The same is true of advisors. *Knowledge, concepts, learned skills, and acquired activities* are essential to being a strong advisor. TASC offers the training necessary to any student activity advisor, and TASC prides itself on a *strong web of support* across the state. What's in it for administrators?

We all want the same thing. We want our students to be connected, happy, and successful. We want our staff to be connected, happy, and successful. We want positive recognition for our achievements. Your student council and your student activity advisors should be your partners in that effort. If student voice is encouraged and heard, if we all work toward the same goals, if we all have ownership in the school, success is much more likely to follow. And students are truly prepared to be strong civic participants throughout their lifetime. If advisors are educated and supported, they are much more likely to stay. What's in it for schools?

Your student led student council which participates in training throughout the year will make a positive difference in school culture and school climate.
