For our high school our student council ran events such as dress-up days, \$1.00 off specials, community golf tournament, spirit kick-off rally, mega relay for MHS clubs, powder puff football, mock homecoming, teacher pie-in-the-face as well as taking control of the planning of other clubs events. This years combined total from all five of our schools came to the amount of \$63,057.01 to be split between the American Red Cross and the MISD Educational Foundation.
