The month of May is National Youth Traffic Safety Month. According to National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) data eight out of the ten deadliest days for youth on our nation's highways are between May and August with May 20th averaging as the deadliest day. Our SHS student council would like to bring awareness to this by hosting a week long project. Each day will focus on a different distraction. Each day will start with a public service announcement relating to the distraction of the day. During passing periods student council members will wear signs with driving safety facts relating to the distraction of the day. Slide shows will be played during all lunches to help re-enforce our message. In addition, pre-selected seniors will participate in the following activities:

Monday – Speeding/Seatbelts:

Morning activity – StuCo members will be in the parking lot with “dum dum’s” and “smarties” checking for seatbelt usage.

Lunch activity - seniors will be given a flat disk and a feather. Four students will race against one another with the feather on the disk. The student who makes it to the end with the feather still on the disk wins.

Tuesday – Distractions/Driving at Night:

Lunch activity - seniors will be given several simple math problems to solve. The students will be asked to solve these problems while being distracted by several StuCo members. Students will then be given another set of simple math problems to complete without distractions. The two sets of problems will be timed and compared for accuracy.

Wednesday – Cell Phones:

Lunch activity – seniors will be shown a series of random images on the projector in the cafeteria. While the images are playing have students send the following text to a friend “The quick red fox jumped over the lazy brown dog.” After sending the text, have the students list as many of the images as they can. Repeat the images while students are not texting and have them list as many of the images as they can. They will then compare their results.

Thursday – Drinking and Driving:

Lunch activity – seniors will be asked to complete a series of tasks first without the drunk driving goggles then with again while wearing the goggles.

Friday – “Grim Reaper” day: The principal will make the following announcement: “The #1 cause of death for teens in the U.S. is traffic accidents. Every day in the US 16 teenagers will lose their lives in automobile accidents. That means that Splendora High School could have lost as many as 16 students since this time yesterday. To bring awareness to this every 30 minutes throughout the day a heartbeat will be played over the intercom to commemorate those teens that will be killed in automobile accidents today. Each time you hear the heartbeat today one of our students will be taken from their class to represent that loss of life.” The grim reaper accompanied by a school police officer will enter a classroom and pull a selected student from the class. The officer will remain in the class and read the students obituary. The obituary will be displayed outside the cafeteria. Each victim's face will be painted white and they will change into black clothing. The “dead” will return to class and go through the rest of the school day without speaking or interacting with other students. A sign will be made for each victim that says something like “I died at 10:08” or “I’m just a memory now.” We may also give the victims death certificates describing the accident that killed them. All of the “dead” will sit together at lunch, not speaking to anyone. (Lunch Activity): A coffin will be displayed in the cafeteria with a mirror placed inside so that when students look in the coffin they will see themselves. (Lunch Activity) When school lets out, the victims lie side by side on the campus grounds each covered with a white sheet to represent those who died. At the end of the day read the following announcement: “If you were disturbed or troubled by the sound of the heartbeat every 30 minutes today, imagine how distraught and upset the friends and families of the victims of these automobile accidents must feel.

Description:	<p>In our community many women have been diagnosed with Breast Cancer. Treatment for this fatal disease is very expensive and very difficult to afford. Why should this happen and what can we do to help? Eight wonderful women made a difference by making it their responsibility to reach out and give a helping hand to those individuals diagnosed with cancer. They first started off by raising money, on their own, to help cancer patients in San Antonio. Of course they took time out of their lives to help those in need without expecting anything in return. The women realized that they wanted to get in touch with their whole community and created the Pink to Do organization. This program is a non-profitable organization, lead by Ms. Narvaez, helps out the men and women with breast cancer. They provide money to pay off some of their medical expenses and for the individual's food. United High School fully supports the cause and participated in raising money for the Pink to Do association.</p> <p>As we all know the breast cancer awareness color is pink and there are many things you can do with the color pink. United High School's student council made bracelets, t-shirts, pink posters, and of course pink ribbons everything was by hand except for the Breast Cancer awareness posters. All materials were paid for out of our student council budget. The Student Council officers spread the word out about donations being accepted by United High School's Student Council by means of informing the student body, faculty and staff about this good cause we were going to start off this school year. As soon as school started we started with the preparations for our breast cancer awareness project.</p> <p>We kicked it off by making our own tie-dyed t-shirts. The officers got together and bought pink, purple, and orange tie-dye paint and the t-shirts at Wal-Mart. We then got together and decorated all the shirts with the pink, purple and orange ink. To finish it off, on the back of each shirt we placed a pink a ribbon. This was a ribbon that signified hope, courage, and support. Hope for all men and women who have been affected by breast cancer. This represented courage for all who have the strength and mentality that they can survive and hit the cancer head on. Support from all the benevolent people that were able to show that they care by contributing to Cancer research or in this case to an organization that helps the men and women in need of financial help due to Cancer.</p> <p>What kind of bracelet is given out and how can someone obtain it? Our members and officers stayed after school and handmade each bracelet as soon as the school year started. The bracelet consisted of pink, purple, whit and orange bandanas. When making them, we started off by tearing two hundred twenty-five bandanas into an inch wide strip. Then the strips would be braded into a bracelet at random. Random because every bracelet was either a solid color or mixed with at most three colors. It was a simple process but very time consuming. It took about 5 weeks to have all the bracelets ready. The only way someone can attain a bracelet is if they donate at least two dollars to the cause. Giving out the bracelets was our way of saying thank you and we hope by wearing the bracelets you spread the word about cancer. Someone can donate ten dollars but they will only receive one bracelet because that would defeat the purpose of donating to Pink to Do.</p> <p>The ribbons were less time consuming than the bracelets. We bought three hundred yards of pink ribbon and immediately cut them into two and a half inch pieces. To every strip we carefully pinned each ribbon with a gold or silver safety pin. We pass out the ribbons to anyone who donates less than two dollars.</p>

Now before we started asking for any kind of donations we made printed out posters of the Pink to Do logo and information about our upcoming projects and the walk on recycled paper. With the permission of the Pink to Do organizer, we printed 15 small posters to place in the hallways and our longhorn store.

We wanted to raise awareness to our school so that the student body can be attentive toward the contribution to Cancer. It was decided that the best way to grab the student's attention is to make a Pink to Do week. From September the 26th through the 30th we had teachers get their students involved by asking students to bestow any kind of donation to Pink to Do during their second block. We would provide each class with 8 bracelets and 20 ribbons. Also donations were accepted at the Student Longhorn Store by anyone who did not have any change to give to their second block class. To make the week entertaining we asked students to wear random things throughout the week. On Monday the students were asked to wear pink socks. When Tuesday came around, students would change their normal shoe laces into pink shoe laces. Then on Wednesday, we all completely exchanged our shoes into pink shoes. On Thursday you would either wear one of our pink bracelets or your one breast cancer bracelet. Finally Friday was pink day. Students were allowed to wear a pink shirt, pink bracelet, and pink shoes throughout the whole day. In doing these activities throughout the whole week, we were trying to demonstrate that United High School fully supports breast cancer awareness.

We had a football game one Friday and we took full advantage of asking for donations. We placed our own Pink to Do stand right next to the bleachers in our football stadium. Donations were asked from all the Longhorn fans supporting our players. There were many bracelets and ribbons given out. After half time passed, we were given permission to go to the opposing side and asked for donations from other team. Thankfully, even though there was not many people on the other side due to the fact that it was an out of town school, a lot of people were generous. Almost everyone wanted a bracelet which guaranteed at least two dollars from each person. By the end of the week we collected a total of \$2,065 dollars.

On October the 1st we participated as a council in the Pink to Do Walk. It was a 2 mile walk and many families attended. To show our support we wore our tie-dye Cancer shirts to the walk. We handed our check to the organization and received Pink to Do t-shirts as a token of appreciation.

Pink to Do is a building organization soon to be a huge success. It is one of our Student Council's biggest projects, especially since our community supports the finding of a cure for breast cancer. Our community in Laredo plays an important role in this project, without them our efforts would not have made a difference.
