## Board of Directors Policy Regarding Endorsements and/or Partnerships

Programs/projects that complement the mission and purpose of student council may be considered by the Board for an endorsement/partnership. Programs or projects interested in forming a partnership with TASC must demonstrate in writing the ways in which the program enhances the work of or provides a resource to student councils. Programs/projects sponsored by member schools are preferred. The Board will approve this type of relationship at the summer board meeting. The board may determine to limit the number of endorsed programs. These relationships benefit TASC member schools directly, either by providing a resource to the council or to individual students. Endorsed programs often exhibit at TASC events and present at TASC events. Benefits to an endorsed program/partner may include access to member schools data for marketing, inclusion in conferences through presentations and reduced exhibit rates, a link on the TASC website, and inclusion in the TASC Resource Guide. Relationships are established by a board vote and are renewed annually. Existing programs must demonstrate participation by and benefit to schools and justify the continuation of the relationship in writing.

<b>Mission/Purpose of Organization</b>	<p>Donate Life Texas (DLT) is the official organ, eye and tissue donor registry for the state of Texas, as established by the Texas State Legislature in 2005.</p> <p>DLT empowers Texans to record the lifesaving decision to be an organ, eye and tissue donor after death.</p> <p>DLT provides community outreach programs to educate the public about the critical need for donation and the importance of donor registration.</p>

**How does your mission align with the goals/purpose of Texas Student Councils? (See About Us tab at [www.tasconline.org](http://www.tasconline.org).)**

Organ and tissue donor registration is a critical and relevant cause that is open to all and that promotes civic responsibility and compassion for others.

The activities associated with promoting donor registration provide excellent opportunities for individuals and groups to learn and share important knowledge, develop leadership and planning skills, educate and influence others in their community in real and measurable ways that do not rely on making a monetary ask.

The result of these efforts will increase the number of registered donors in our state which gives hope to the nearly 10,000 Texans currently awaiting a lifesaving organ transplant and more than 100,000 waiting nationally.

**Describe in detail the process for TASC member school participation in this program.**

Participation by each school can be tailored by the Student Council and school administration to best meet the needs and parameters of the environment.

Possible elements of participation can include:

- Host a donor registration webinar / booth / table / campaign at/with the school or local events.
- Contact other schools or local companies and businesses to create a Donor Registration Challenge (some groups / schools hold competitions).
- Present organ, eye & tissue donation information during an assembly or in health / science classes – available to provide virtually.
- Design social media graphics, posters, flyers, and other materials to promote donor registration.
- Meet / Speak with donor families / transplant recipients in their community to learn more about their experience – available virtually.
- Ability to speak with transplant centers at an area hospital to learn about the transplant process and speak with those who are waiting.
- Ability to speak with an organ, eye and tissue recovery organization in their area to learn about the recovery and donation process.
- Contact local officials about proclamations declaring a Donate Life Donor Registration Day or Month in their community.
- Send press releases about their school's campaign to local media.

Donate Life Texas and its members will provide training materials for each council and help connect them with appropriate resources such as Donate Life speakers and/or volunteers in their community. A standard kit of educational materials will be provided for each participating school and will include printable / emailable fliers, info sheets, registration drive ideas and social media graphics.

Schools can choose to create customized donor registration campaign pages using the tools on the DLT website. Those who do so will be able to track the number of registrations recorded by their campaign and compare to prior year's activities. A great way to take campaigns virtual.

<p><b>What is the benefit of this partnership to the TASC organization as a whole, its member schools or individual advisors/students?</b></p>	<p>Partnering with Donate Life Texas is beneficial in terms of the program support it can provide and the positive public perception the issue of donation enjoys. It is also uniquely inclusive in a way that other causes and activities may not be.</p> <p>Unlike many activities, donor registration does not rely on fundraising from participants. Donor registration is free and takes only a few minutes for individuals to complete regardless of age, gender, economic status, health, faith, or ethnic and cultural background.</p>
<p><b>What is the benefit of this partnership to your organization?</b></p>	<p>Nearly 10,000 Texans are awaiting organ transplants and thousands more are in need of a lifechanging tissue or cornea transplant. Registering more people helps make more organs and tissues available for those whose lives hang in the balance.</p> <p>Registering more people relies heavily on public education at the grassroots level. By engaging young leaders with this issue, we hope not only to host registration drives today but also to spark the powerful, lifelong conversations among friends and family that will have even further-reaching effects.</p>
<p><b>Is there a fee for TASC schools to attain resources or participate in the program</b></p>	<p>No</p>
<p><b>Does participation in this program require student fundraising of any type?</b></p>	<p>DLT currently prefers to focus activities on registration and education. However, schools that choose to raise funds can channel them into their own activities supporting donor registration or to Donate Life Texas.</p>
<p><b>Is this program available to student councils statewide?</b></p>	<p>Yes</p>
<p><b>Describe in detail the resources available to TASC schools through this partnership.</b></p>	<p>Donate Life Texas and its members will provide training materials for each council and help connect them with appropriate resources such as Donate Life volunteers and member organizations in their community. A standard kit of educational materials will be provided for each participating school and will include, printable / emailable fliers, info sheets, registration drive ideas and social media tools.</p> <p>Schools can choose to create customized donor registration campaign pages using the tools on the DLT website. Those who do so will be able to track the number of registrations recorded by their campaign and compare to prior year's activities.</p>

<p><b>Describe the plan for serving schools across the state of Texas.</b></p>	<p>Each participating school will be connected with the Donate Life Texas member organization in their area to initiate the program and receive training and resources.</p> <p>The program can be implemented by each school at their convenience throughout the school year.</p>
<p><b>Describe your intent to exhibit or present at the TASC Advisors Workshop in September, the TASC Middle Level Conference in November, and the TASC Annual Conference in April. Forms are available under Exhibitors/Sponsors at <a href="http://www.tasconline.org">www.tasconline.org</a>.)</b></p>	<p>Donate Life Texas would be pleased to participate in these conferences, should the opportunity be available to us.</p> <p>A presentation would be designed to cover an overview of the program described above, highlight updates to the program, touch on the training elements, and include a testimonial speaker – a donor family member or transplant recipient – to share their story.</p> <p>The Donate Life Texas display table at the conferences would allow participants to join the donor registry, ask questions and speak one-on-one with Donate Life Texas representatives.</p> <p>We have enjoyed attending conferences in the past and would be open to attending virtually and in-person throughout the 2021-2022 school year.</p>

<p><b><u>Continuing Programs Only:</u> Explain how TASC school/student participation has increased or changed since the partnership began.</b></p>	<p>DLT launched the online portal at the start of the 2016-17 school year, and we have had some helpful learning experiences since.</p> <p>DLT's participation in the TASC Conferences helped students and faculty understand how to better use the online resources to create their own activities and campaigns. We were able to connect with students who have participated, new students and teachers. We plan to attend the TASC Conference in 2022 and would like to explore other conference opportunities where we can connect with faculty and students.</p>
<p><b><u>Continuing Programs Only:</u> Describe any <u>new plans</u> for serving schools and student councils across the state of Texas.</b></p>	<p>We would like to work alongside TASC to learn ways we can better communicate with the Student Council groups throughout Texas. (example: provide presentations to Student Council groups/schools and/or during Teacher Inservice days and communicate with STUCO leaders via email). DLT is in the process of updating our public website and will enhance the offerings on the portal. DLT will modernize the appearance of not only the website, but the program as well.</p>
<p><b><u>Continuing Programs Only:</u> Please share any suggestions you have regarding ways that TASC can add value to this partnership.</b></p>	<p>The in-person conference participation was a key component to helping roll out a program or reintroduce. It helps students and faculty learn about the resources available. Having a schedule of District conferences in advance would be helpful for planning to attend and present in the most effective way possible. It would be great to be considered at a live breakout session during these conferences. We truly enjoyed participating in past conferences.</p>

	<p>It would also be helpful to know more about how the programs are communicated to the schools other than at the conferences and what opportunities might be available to enhance understanding of how to engage with our program.</p> <p>Is there an opportunity to reach TASC STUCO sponsors and student leadership via email outside of conferences?</p> <p>Is there an opportunity to offer a presentation at Teachers Inservice Days or larger TASC district presentations?</p>
