Board of Directors Policy Regarding Endorsements and/or Partnerships

Programs/projects that complement the mission and purpose of student council may be considered by the Board for an endorsement/partnership. Programs or projects interested in forming a partnership with TASC must demonstrate in writing the ways in which the program enhances the work of or provides a resource to student councils. Programs/projects sponsored by member schools are preferred. The Board will approve this type of relationship at the summer board meeting. The board may determine to limit the number of endorsed programs. These relationships benefit TASC member schools directly, either by providing a resource to the council or to individual students. Endorsed programs often exhibit at TASC events and present at TASC events. Benefits to an endorsed program/partner may include access to member schools data for marketing, inclusion in conferences through presentations and reduced exhibit rates, a link on the TASC website, and inclusion in the TASC Resource Guide. Relationships are established by a board vote and are renewed annually. Existing programs must demonstrate participation by and benefit to schools and justify the continuation of the relationship in writing.

<p>What is the benefit of this partnership to the TASC organization as a whole, its member schools or individual advisors/students?</p>	<p>Because Say What! provides free resources and training for youth to lead projects and educate communities on the harmful effects of tobacco, individual students can grow as leaders by leading projects, individual advisors can have free tools and activities that enable them to empower their students to lead, member schools benefit by participating in projects and activities that improve the health of its students and community members along with connecting to a statewide movement, and TASC as a whole has the opportunity to elevate the activity and potential of its entire membership by endorsing the Say What! program.</p>

<p>Describe the plan for serving schools across the state of Texas.</p>	<p>In addition to networking through TASC, we will also use other regional contacts at ESC regional offices and our mailing list to promote our free youth leadership materials and training opportunities.</p>

We will share innovative youth leadership activities and strategies, current tobacco prevention information especially focusing on e-cigarettes, hookah and smokeless tobacco, along with information on our free resources and how our Mini-Grant Kits make it easy for StuCos to work towards earning recognition.</p>
<p><u>Continuing Programs Only:</u> Provide data on the number of TASC schools that participated in this program in the previous year.</p>	<p>For the FY23 school year, 20 different StuCos used Mini-Grant Kits, 30 different StuCos registered their group on TxSayWhat.com, 3 different StuCos attended an in-person Action Summit, and 7 different StuCos attended a virtual action summit. We believe these are conservative numbers as some youth groups do not identify that they are student council groups.</p>
<p><u>Continuing Programs Only:</u> Explain how TSAC school/student participation has increased or changed since the partnership began.</p>	<p>In addition to new StuCos joining Say What! every year, participation by individuals at the Middle Level and High School conferences in tobacco prevention via social media has grown considerably.</p>
<p><u>Continuing Programs Only:</u> Describe any <u>new plans</u> for serving schools and student councils across the state of Texas.</p>	<p>We are designing new member kits exclusively for student council groups across Texas. The kits will include a variety of materials to help student council's promote living a tobacco-free, vape-free life but also recruit new members to join their student group and the Say What! movement. Once a student council joins the Say What! movement, they will automatically receive a new member kit.</p>
