NAME OF PROJECT: Kicking Off A Year Of Kindness PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES: Our purpose is to change the current trends on social media and in our school to make kindness normal in our classrooms, school and community. BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT: To make a positive change in our school, we started a "Year of Kindness" for the 2018-19 school year. Our Council and Officers worked along side our advisors during the summer to plan a Kick-Off Convocation for August 7, 2018, the week before school started. We designed a logo, ordered t-shirts, and invited the other high schools in our school district to join us. We had Houston Kraft speak to our newly appointed "Kindness Ambassadors". We are so proud that our idea and initiative has spread throughout our district of 60,000 students and 6,000 teachers now taking part with us. We just completed hosting a Middle School Kindness Convocation that was also successful. The change in school climate has improved tremendously. **DESCRIPTION OF INVOLVEMENT: A) STUDENT COUNCIL MEMBERS:** The first day of school, we kicked off the Kindness Year. The first school week was filled with nonstop positive vibes and the color orange – the campaign's official color – everywhere. Student Council started off the project by energetically greeting fellow students and staff members at the front door each morning, passing out candy, distributing "pay it forward" compliment cards, clipping on positivity clothespins, decorating hallways, orchestrating kindness bingo games at lunch, assisting custodians, and giving daily kindness text messages, and social media challenges. Each day also had an official theme that included dressing up in orange, neon, twin clothing, camouflage and sport jerseys. B) OTHER STUDENTS: Each school brought 200 students, and we identified them as Kindness Ambassadors for this school year. We hired Houston Kraft, Co-Founder of Character Strong, to speak and train our Kindness Ambassadors and teach them what they need to do to make kindness normal within our schools. C) OTHER ORGANIZATIONS: We had all clubs and sports teams in the school sign up for a week of projects and morning greetings. Some projects include a flash mob during lunch pulled off by our drill team, compliments in restrooms from Fellowship of Christian Athletes, a Giving Tree where students can pull off a card of encouragement from our Volleyball team. D) FACULTY: Our faculty members were trained by Houston Kraft to know what it was and how to implement kindness into the classrooms. They have been active participants during the entire year. E) COMMUNITY: We secured sponsors from our community to cover the cost of the convocation, tshirts, and spirit sticks. Our community partners have been strong supporters of us throughout the year.
