

TASC DRESS CODE

All garments should meet the following standards:

- Be opaque (not see-through);
- Have sleeves (Garments with no sleeves may have a cover-up added up to bring the garment into dress code.);
- · Have a front and back:
- Fit at or cover the waistline;
- Not show cleavage or chest;
- Be no shorter than mid-thigh;
- Have no rips or holes above mid-thigh through which skin shows; and
- Not display or refer directly or indirectly to alcohol or alcoholic products, drugs or drug paraphernalia, tobacco or tobacco products, profanity, race, politics, violence, offensive language, gender, or sexuality;
- Shorts: Are NOT permitted at TASC events held during the school year, but ARE permitted at summer programs and must be no shorter than mid-thigh.
- Head coverings, except for medical or religious purposes, are NOT to be worn when inside a building.

Stu's keynote "The Big Elephant" begins with a mystery in the wild and ends with a powerful truth about leadership. Deep in a wildlife refuge, chaos was unfolding—and no one had the answer. Then one simple question changed everything. What followed wasn't just a breakthrough in nature—it was a masterclass in leadership, reminding us that real leaders don't wait to grow up—they show up.

Together, Stu and Kevin created The Story Exchange, a digital storytelling program from The Chalkboard Agency that uses real stories to strengthen connection, empathy, and mental health. In a time when schools are searching for meaningful ways to help students feel seen and supported, their work reminds us that real change begins with a shared story.

Kevin's closing keynote carries a clear message: leaders need a plan. How do we take all the energy and ideas from this conference and turn them into action? With humor, honesty, and practical insight, Kevin shows how small shifts in mindset can turn inspiration into real impact back at school.


